### **NOW WHAT?**

According to the Municipality's Act, when a resignation occurs, in the office or Councillor or Chairperson, the administrator shall

(a) within sixty days, set a date for a special election meeting or an election poll for the purpose of electing a person to fill the vacancy; or

(b) determine that the vacancy be filled at the next annual meeting.

A date for an election meeting has not yet been set, but will be advertised in the Guardian and throughout the community.

Vice Chair Brian Andrew will chair the October 28, 2008 Council Meeting.

### **Who Could Become Chair of Miltonvale Park?**

The qualifications for nomination and for holding office as a mayor, chairperson or councillor of a municipality are that the nominee is

(a) not less than eighteen years of age;

(b) a Canadian citizen; and

(c) resident for a period of one year preceding the date of the nomination.

### **What Does the Chair Do?**

· The mayor or chairperson is the chief executive officer of the council and shall preside at meetings of the council.

· The mayor or chairperson may appoint standing committees from among the members of the council for such purposes as he may determine.

### **Does the Chair Get Paid?**

Councillors and the Chair receive remuneration based upon their meeting attendance (Usually \$35-45/mtg).

Please note that if a current councillor decides to run for the position of chair, this may require an election to be held for a councillor position. The next "regular" election is currently scheduled for early November 2009, so terms would expire then.

### **FEDERAL ELECTION IMPACTS OFFICE**

The Winsloe Lions Hall is a polling station for the federal election on October 14<sup>th</sup>, 2008; therefore, Council office hours have been **cancelled** for that Tuesday, as access to the building is restricted.

## Miltonvale Community Park

Thanks to Jessica MacKinnon and Nick MacDonald, who supervised youth at the community park throughout the summer. Some of the most popular activities at the park this year were 4-square, baseball, playing on the equipment outside, painting, golf, badminton, crafts, bubbles, biking and especially watching movies. An average of 3.2 children visited the park each day.



The Cornwall and Area Minor Baseball Association rented the ball field on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday evenings to run their youth program, and a local men's league used the field on Wednesdays.

Council was pleased to learn that the Park Shelter at 413 Sleepy Hollow Road will be used for a poll in the October 14<sup>th</sup> federal election. This is a great chance to have residents from the area to check out the shelter if they haven't been there yet!

The phone number of the shelter is 368-7587. Bookings are done through Joannie MacKinnon, at 368-2365; however, the shelter will be shut down for the winter later this month.



A UV light was purchased for the shelter in early July, and the water problems were corrected immediately.

## LIGHTS

Council has approved the installation of several streetlights for the community as a pilot project for a one year trial period. Two lights have been installed where the Sleepy Hollow Road intersects with

Heather Drive and with Royalty Road. The province has been asked to consider erecting a light on Rte 7 where the Crabbe and MacKenzie Roads intersect.

# YOGA Classes

Council has received funding through the province's Community Recreation Support Program for a Physical Activity Project called EMP-HOUR (Exercise in Miltonvale Park Hour). Plans are underway for a series of yoga classes to be held at the Milton Community Hall. Hampshire based instructor Brenda Bradford is willing to teach either Yoga Basics (75 minute gentle stretching class) or Beyond Basics (90 minute more advanced class), or a multi-level class, if necessary.

Classes are usually arranged in a block of 7-8 weeks, and Brenda is available on Monday or Thursday nights or during daytime hours, or classes could be held on Friday nights. The regular cost for her classes is about \$9/ evening; however, the grant will subsidize this cost to make them more affordable. The final cost is yet to be determined.

## COMMUNITY MEETS OVER WATER AND SEWER ISSUES

### *Water and Wastewater Needs Assessment to be Revealed.*

Residents and landowners in the Community of Miltonvale Park are invited to a public meeting on 7:30 p.m. Monday, October 6, 2008 at the Winsloe Lions Club. The meeting will address the subject of water and sewer in the North Milton, Milton, Sleepy Hollow, and Springvale areas. Consultant Kelly Galloway, from Engineering Technologies Canada notes "The purpose of the meeting is to explain the results of a recently completed water and wastewater needs assessment for Miltonvale Park and to obtain validation of these results from residents." The information obtained from over 600 surveys distributed in June, and soil mapping has been compiled into maps showing whether on-site sewage systems are sustainable in the future, for each property in the community. A water consultant from TerrAtlantic, who has experience in sites involving landfills, will be in attendance to explain ground water assessment and priority areas for off-site water servicing.

Councillor George Piercey, a member of the community's water and sewer committee, encourages all residents to attend the meeting. "If residents cannot be at Monday's meeting," Piercey notes, "they should drop into the Council office on Tuesday afternoon until 6:30 p.m. or Wednesday morning to obtain information on their property."

This project has received funding through the Canada – Prince Edward Island New Deal for Cities and Communities – Community Capacity Building Fund which is managed by the Prince Edward Island Department of Communities, Cultural Affairs and Labour.

## CHILD BURSARY PROGRAM

All parents/guardians of children who live in the Community of Miltonvale Park can receive up to \$50 per child, per year, to reimburse costs incurred for their child(ren)'s extra-curricular

## COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

Council usually meets the 4th Tuesday of each month at 4:30 p.m. at the Winsloe Lions Hall; the next meeting is planned for **October 28**. Residents are encouraged to attend. Minutes are posted on-line, *after* they have been approved at the next meeting.



## SPECIAL PLANNING AREA REGULATIONS –

The Miltonvale Park Community Council has received funding, and is the lead municipality, for a “**Planning Policies Affecting Selected Rural Communities**” project. The Special Planning Area Regulations severely limit subdivision within the area. P. Wood and Associates was chosen as the consultant. Representatives from the thirteen communities within the Charlottetown, Stratford and Cornwall Special Planning Areas have met several times and structured a management committee. A workshop for councils and planning boards was held on September 13th. A second follow-up workshop took place on September 24 and allowed communities to discuss their situations and capacities.

Phil Wood is now preparing a draft presentation which is expected to be reviewed by the management committee on October 15<sup>th</sup>. Three public meetings, one for each Special Planning Area will be held to obtain feedback, and then a final report will be presented to Government. Watch The Guardian for the date of the meeting for Miltonvale Park, later this month.

The communities intend to recommend a new model to the Department of Community, Cultural Affairs and Labour. One option is to allow communities with an Official Plan and that meet minimum conditions be permitted to remove themselves from the Special Planning Area regulations. This project has received funding through the Canada – Prince Edward Island New Deal for Cities and Communities – Community Capacity Building Fund which is managed by the Prince Edward Island Department of Communities, Cultural Affairs and Labour.

## OFFICIAL PLAN UPDATE

Consultants, Phil Wood and ADI have been working on mapping and are waiting for information from the water and sewer study, and for the future of the Special Planning Area regulations to be determined.

## NEED A DEVELOPMENT PERMIT?

If you are planning to ...

- construct a new building,
- locate or change the location of any building or structure on a lot,
- locate a mobile home on a lot,
- make any structural alterations that will change the exterior dimensions of any building, including decks.
- build a swimming pool,
- change the use of any building or land
- intensify any non-conforming use,
- construct a fence taller than six feet,
- or erect a satellite dish.

... Visit or call Development Officer Alfie Wakelin at the office in the Winsloe Lions Club on Monday mornings, from 8:00 a.m.–noon **until mid-Nov.** Allow time for your permit to be approved **before** you plan to start construction, and call ahead to ensure Alfie will be in.

Permit fees will be **doubled** for construction that has started without the necessary permits. **Alfie will not be in the office on Thanksgiving Monday!**

## Waste Watch Fall Clean Up Weeks

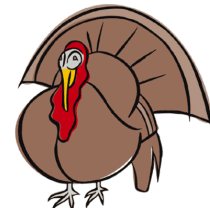
**Metal – Monday November 3**

**Compost – Monday, November 10**

**Waste –Monday, November 17**

Multiple items must be bundled and tied. Nothing must be more than 75 lbs or longer than 4 ft. Wood stumps bigger than 15” are waste. Categories must be kept separate at the roadside. Compostables should be in paper bags or open, rigid containers. Waste items should be in rigid containers or clear plastic bags or bulk items can be placed directly on the curbside. The following items will NOT be collected and MUST be taken to a Waste Watch Drop –Off Center: household hazardous waste, appliances with freon, large furniture (mattresses, sofas, box springs) or appliances, tires, propane tanks, construction, demolition or renovation material.
